Project POTUS is a national education initiative for middle school from the Benjamin Harrison Presidential Site.

***PROJECT POTUS HQ NEEDS YOUR HELP**

Volunteer to review 1-minute or less video projects about the American presidents from middle school students all over the U.S in Spring 2025.

The contest:

Project POTUS challenges students in middle school to choose a POTUS and create a video of 1-minute or less. The students will submit their video projects to the Presidential Site starting Election Day 2024. and with assistance from Citizen Jurors, Project POTUS HQ will review the video submissions and allocate awards to 45 videos that are the determined to be the best for their chosen president. The Citizen Juror's Role:

Judging will take place online, over the course of a few weeks in March 2025, after the contest has closed for student submission. The Citizen Juror role does not require any in person commitment, and is estimated to take about 2 hours in total. There will be opportunities to self select to review more video projects for those who have interest in taking on a larger role in the Citizen Jury. The official scorecard, calendar of judging, and all necessary materials will be provided to Citizen Jurors by February 1, 2025.
